September, when I was young was the month of the Holy Cross. We all have to take up our cross in this our life, but not to worry—there are lots of Simons and may we graciously accept their help!

“Will you let me be your servant? Let me be as Christ to you? Pray that I may have the grace to let you be my servant too.”

We hope everybody had a nice holiday. Congratulations to all our young people who have done and were successful in their exams! We wish you well. We used to be told when I was young. “Work well, play well, and pray well!” I think it was great advice. “Do your best and God will do the rest” great advice. Welcome back to the boys and girls in Bunscoil we missed you. Enjoy your school days. It’s where you are meant to be and what you are meant to be doing for now. Tosnú maith leath no hoibre! - a good beginning is half the work!

This month we begin on First Friday. Paul hopes the people aren’t forgetting what he taught them He wants them not to be immoral. They must be ready to meet “the Bridegroom”

3rd 22nd in Ordinary time. Have mercy on me God. I cry to you all day long. You are good and forgiving, full of mercy to all who call to you. Paul tells us not to model ourselves on the behaviour of the world around us!. We have to use our “new minds” God will tell us! Jesus starts to tell his disciples how he’ll end up.

8th Happy Birthday Mary! We celebrate Mary’s birthday. Paul tells us in the second reading — we are to become true images of God’s Son! Exult for joy in the Lord!

9th St Kieran of Clonmacnoise. Educated at Clonard by St Finian he became known as one of the “twelve Apostles of Ireland.” From there he went to the island of Aranmore, where he became the disciple of Abbot St Enda who advised him to found a monastery in the centre of the country. He died of the plague a year after founding Clonmacnoise, which became a great centre of culture in Ireland.

10th 23rd in Ordinary time. Paul says we are to owe nothing to anyone except mutual love! When the Lord commissioned the prophet Ezekiel he told him “if you do not speak to the wicked man, I will hold you responsible for his death.” We must love our neighbour as ourselves! Jesus told his apostles “if two of you agree to ask anything at all, it will be granted to you by my father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I shall be there with them.”

12th Holy Name of Mary & St Ailbe. Mary’s privileges and all the graces we receive through her intercession!

St Ailbe of Emly’s feast is today. He as first bishop of Emly. Welsh sources associate him with St David of Wales—supposed to have baptized David. He is buried in Emly.

13th St John Chrysostom. Born in Antioch 349 received a fine education then spent some time in uninterrupted Contemplation on the Word of God as a hermit. He found his true calling as a priest in Antioch and then as bishop of Constantinople. He was an eloquent preacher - Chrysostom means golden mouth.

14th Exaltation of the Holy Cross which draws everything and frees us from from the enemy.

15th Our Lady of Sorrows, This is your mother!

16th Ss Cornelius & Cyprian. Cornelius was Pope and Cyprian bishop of Carthage they both became martyrs.

17th 24th Sunday “Pay what you owe me!” Could he not have pity for his servant? Christ died and came to life, so that he might be Lord of the dead and of the living

21st St Matthew Apostle & Evangelist. Used to be a tax collector. He wrote the first Gospel. He begins with a genealogy showing Jesus to be a descendant of David and takes great pains to show the teachings of the Law and prophets have culminated in Christ. He died a martyr’s death in either Persia or Ethiopia.

23rd St Padre Pio.

24th 25th Sunday. I love this. He goes, without stopping to find labourers. Doesn’t he always give us a lot more than we deserve!

25th St Fionbar –the fair haired. Bishop of Cork. He died 25th October. He used to wear a glove his hand was so shiny.

26th Ss Cosmas & Damien Brothers and doctors martyred in Diocletian persecution

27th St Vincent de Paul

29th Ss Michael Gabriel & Raphael Archangels

30th St Jerome the ardent strong aesthetic.. He finally settled in a cave in Bethlehem. He studied Hebrew in penance He died in 420 but we have his Bible translations

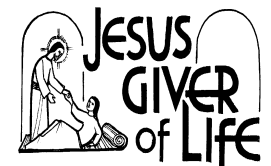
